This office has recently completed an audit of Machinists AFL-CIO, Local 330 under the Compliance Audit Program (CAP) to determine compliance with provisions of the Labor-Management Reporting and Disclosure Act of 1959, (LMRDA). As discussed during the exit interview with you and Tom on September 16, 2005 the following matters were disclosed during the CAP. The matters listed below are minor in nature and not an exhaustive list of all possible problem areas since the audit conducted was limited in scope.

Overall, the financial operations were in order – we discussed some minor record keeping issues; specifically:

- Checks written in disbursements journal, then voided for various reasons but still added in the total disbursements for that particular month.
- Previous receipt books used had no sequential numbers. Currently the receipt book used by the union should be the type you continue to use.
- ☐ Figures recorded in recording secretary's book not in balance with secretary treasurer's figures.

Additionally we discussed the importance of an inventory list for the union's fixed assets. This list can be verified along with the semi-annual trustee audit. And finally, whenever there are changes to your local's constitution and bylaws, include that amended copy with your next LM filing. You provided me with a current copy during my visit, however on file with our office was a dated version (1995).
